Licences (Coco-de-Mer Dealers) Regulations

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Licences (Coco-de-Mer Dealers) Regulations.

Application for a licence

2. An application for a licence to deal in mature coco-de-mer nuts shall be in the Form provided by the Authority.

Conditions of a licence (S.I. 42/1993)

3. A licence to deal in mature Coco-de-Mer nuts shall be subject to the following conditions –
 - (a) that the licensee shall not buy mature Coco-de-Mer nuts except from an officer of the Ministry responsible for the management of the Coco-de-Mer (Management) Decree nominated for this purpose by the Minister responsible for that Ministry;
 - (b) that the licensee shall not deal in mature Coco-de-Mer nuts except at the place of business specified in the licence;
 - (c) that the licensee shall display the licence and a notice in the Form D in the Schedule to the Coco-de-Mer (Management) Decree, in a conspicuous place at the place of business specified in the licence;
 - (d) that the licensee shall keep in the place of business specified in the licence a Purchase and Sale Book in the Form E of the Schedule to the Coco-de-Mer (Management) Decree, in which shall be entered the particulars of mature Coco-de-Mer nuts numbers, and dates and details of purchase and sales.

Validity of licence (SI 4/1992)

4. The Authority may, on an application, grant a licence for a period of 1 year or 3 years.

Non-transferability of the licence

5. A licence to deal in mature Coco-de-Mer nuts is not transferable:

Provided that the place of business may, with the written permission of the Authority, be transferred from one premises to another.

Fees to accompany application for a licence

6.(1) An application under Regulation 2 shall, subject to sub-regulation (2), shall be accompanied by the fees set out in the Schedule.

(2) A person who was the holder of a licence and who applies, after the expiration of the licence, for a licence shall, unless the Authority is satisfied that he had, during the period between the expiration of his previous licence and his application, ceased to deal in mature coco-de-mer nuts, be liable, in addition to the licence fee and any other penalty under the Act, to a surcharge equal 10% of the licence fee for each month or part thereof which has elapsed from the date of the expiration of the previous licence and the date of the lodging of the application.

(3) Where the licence is refused, the Authority shall refund the licence fee and the surcharge to the applicant.
